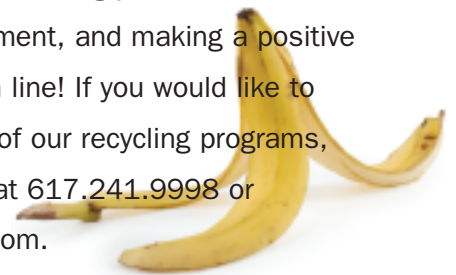
"Stuff" redefined.

Our cover stock contains a minimum of 10 percent post-consumer waste.
